A Glimpse of a Tragedy without an End, an exhibition on Kashmir and the plight of Kashmiri Hindus, designed by award-winning journalist and author Francois Gautier, was on display in the Crown Plaza, Monroe New Jersey. The exhibition was hosted by World Brahman Federation (WBF) a not for profit organization registered in the state of New York, to raise awareness about terrorism and its impact on the lives of innocent people. Its current exhibition depicts the effects of terrorism on the Hindus of Kashmir, known as the 'Pandits', who underwent a near genocide in 1990 due to violence from Jehadi terrorism.

The attendants of the conventions and others who saw the exhibition were visibly moved by the atrocities committed on the miniscule Kashmiri Community. WBF has pledged solidarity with the Kashmiri Pandits in their struggle and will support different initiatives for the betterment of this community.

In the session dedicated to the plight of Kashmiri Pandits, Dr. Rabinder Koul, Director of FACT_USA pointed out that the Islamic terrorism in Kashmir was started with the express intent of Islamizing the State to make it Darul-Islam and implement Nizam-e-Mustafa. These were the slogan blurring from the Loudspeakers in the Mosques in Kashmir, while threatening Kashmiri Hindu Minority. In Kashmir, an earthly paradise, blameless people are suffering hellish persecution not for anything they did but for being who they are. The Kashmiri Pandits, the Hindu minority that has lived in Kashmir for 5,000 years, would like to go home."
